Course Description

This course is designed to enhance the knowledge about basic microeconomic principles that will provide the foundation for future work in economics and give insight into how economic models can help us think about important real-world phenomena. Topics include standard supply and demand determination and interaction in different market structure(s). The objective of this course is on economic behavior of individuals, firms, and markets where both competitive market and markets with imperfect competition will be considered. Emphasis will be placed on problem solving and application of microeconomic theory to selected public policy issues. Calculus and Graphical methods will be used extensively.
